- The annual exhibit of “Quilts and Their Stories” is not judged or juried.
- Quilts that have been displayed at the CFM previously may not be displayed unless specific request by CFM has been made.
- CFM reserves the right to limit the number of quilts each person has on exhibit.
- All quilts must be accompanied by a “story.” (CFM reserves the right to edit, rewrite, and/or publish each story) Quilts without stories may not be exhibited or included in the book of quilts. See page 2 for some story starters.
- A 3” sleeve must be basted on the quilt for it to be hung – they show better.
- Quilts with a sleeve may still be exhibited in showcases or other venues at the discretion of CFM staff.
- Antique or delicate quilts do not need sleeves and will be placed out of reach of the general public.
- Quilts must be brought in to the Coopersville Farm Museum, located at 375 Main Street, Coopersville, Michigan, July 8 – 19, 2008 only.
- Quilts must be picked up at the same location October 4 – 11, 2008, between the hours of 10am-4pm, unless other arrangements have been made with CFM staff.
- The Coopersville Farm Museum is not responsible for loss or damage.
- The Coopersville Farm Museum will not alter or repair quilts. In the event of a mishap, you will be notified by CFM staff within 48 hours of discovery. You will be given the opportunity to make necessary alterations or repairs to your quilt and return it to the Coopersville Farm Museum within one week.
- Photos of you and your item will be taken when you bring your quilt in.
- Photos taken by Coopersville Farm Museum staff are the property of the Coopersville Farm Museum and may be used in promotional material (including, but not limited to website, catalogs, books, press, magazines, or any other form of media) and for archival purposes without compensation.
