It's time to bring your quilts in for the HUGE Quilt Show!

There is a loan form enclosed with this newsletter that will need to



accompany your quilt. Remember, <u>old</u> and <u>new</u> alike are welcome. The only repeat quilts that are permitted, however, are those that qualify as 'Director's Choice' quilts. The 'Director's Choice' exhibit for 2013 is 'Will it go 'Round in Circles?' Is your quilt primarily made up of circles, if so, it will be part of the 'Director's Choice' display. All other quilts

will be displayed throughout the museum, hung whenever possible, put in showcases if they are delicate, and shared for all to see. We can only guarantee hanging quilts that have 3" sleeves on the back of them, and if you are bringing in multiple quilts, and we run out of hanging space, we may not be able to hang all of them.

Quilts & Their Stories Schedule of Events

<u>Quilts for the exhibit</u> of 'Quilts & Their Stories' will only be accepted *<u>July 9 - 20</u>, during regular business hours. Tuesday through Saturday, 10am - 4pm

<u>Director's Choice exhibit:</u> "Will it go 'Round in Circles?" What does this mean to you? Well...if your quilt uses circles as its main pattern, and it's been in our show recently, it can still be brought in, otherwise repeat quilts are not generally permitted.

The <u>exhibit dates</u> are <u>August 1 - September 28</u>. We cannot remove quilts early or put them in late...this tends to leave holes in our show. Invite friends from other circles/groups to display their quilts too! If multiple quilts are turned in, only two are guaranteed to be hung. Every attempt is made to hang all quilts with sleeves though.

<u>Crazy Ladies Quilting Circle</u> welcomes you every Thursday morning from 10am - noon with complimentary refreshments. Take a look over their shoulders while they work on individual and group projects, ask questions, or sit and visit a while.

Quilter's Reception July 31, Wednesday, 6pm-8pm. Quilt Show Preview, Quilt Raffle, Free Gift, Silent Auction, and Light Refreshments. Contributors to the exhibit receive two free admission passes good for this reception or a visit to the exhibit during regular business hours. Those without a quilt (or quilts) in the show may purchase tickets for \$5 each. Tickets are available now.

<u>2013 Quilter's Challenge Items</u>: The deadline for entry is July 20! Beginning July 31, at the Quilter's Reception, visitors are entitled to one vote per visit for the People's Choice Blue Ribbon Award from among the challenge items brought in. They will all be located in the area nearest the front desk.

2014 Quilter's Challenge Kits: Kits are available for \$5 each (while supplies last) and contain small fabric pieces for you to create something wonderful with. This year's kits are being furnished by Mary Dyke. Bring your finished project, made using the challenge kit pieces plus your own fabric, to the museum, by the 2014 show deadline, for a chance to win the People's Choice Blue Ribbon.

<u>Summerfest Kids Day</u>, Saturday, August 7, 10am - 4pm: Free Family Friendly Event! <u>Sewing for Kids</u> ages 8 & up will be added to all the other special activities in honor of the quilt show. Sewing will be taught by members of the Crazy Ladies Quilting Circle. Kids Day is sponsored by River Village and The Meadows Apartments.

<u>Marathon Quilts:</u> The 2012 Marathon Quilts are being brought in as they are completed and put on display early. They will be part of the 2013 exhibit and then raffled off in years to come. The first place quilt will remain with the museum as part of our permanent collection. This year's raffles are from quilts made at the museum in 2010 and 2011. Some will be raffled off at the Quilter's Reception and others at the Last Hoorah!

Quilter's Marathon: Teams wanted for participation in the Quilter's Marathon, which will be held on Thursday, September 26, from 10am - 4pm. Teams of four people compete to make a quilt in a day. Limited to eight teams. \$8 per person for lunch. MUST register by September 19 to participate. Register for the Marathon by calling the front desk at 616-997-8555.

<u>Dinner Show:</u> On September 13, Friday, plan to attend a very special evening with a catered dinner (chicken & Swiss steak, salad, veggies, potato salad, rolls, beverage, and dessert), live music by Sorensens & Eno, and a Decorative Feed Sack Presentation by RheaMae Hubbel. Cost for the event is \$26, members \$21 each, \$10 kids 12 & under. Doors open at 5:00 pm, dinner at 6:00 pm, and Feed Sack Presentation at 6:30 pm. Quilt Show & Museum Tour included in cost of event.

The Last Hoorah! includes a trunk show with Darla Parks, a live auction, quilt raffle, and refreshments. Those with quilts in the show may sign up to retrieve their quilts immediately following the event. Cost is \$5 per person.




